Your personal data will be stored in our system for **four weeks** after receipt and deleted afterwards (§ 6 para. 2 CoronaVO).

You are not obligated to provide your personal data; the operator also will not check the accuracy of your data. However, if you do not provide us with your personal data, you may not be allowed to our services (§ 6 para. 4 CoronaVO).

Reference to the rights of the persons concerned:

According to the DS-GVO, you have the following rights: information about the personal data we process about you; correction if the data is incorrect or restriction of our processing; deletion if we are no longer obliged to store it.
